

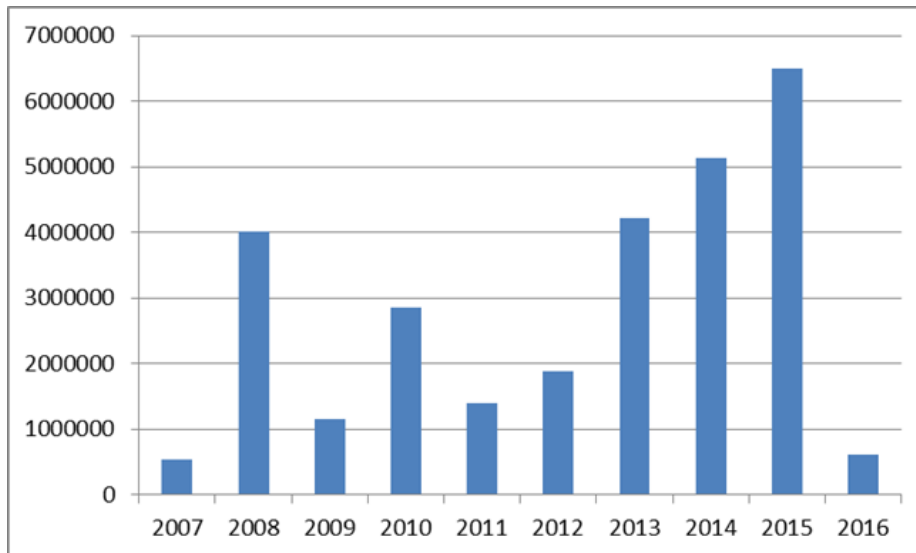

H2020 and JYU

- **Funding portfolio improving and developing**
- **In H2020 19 projects**
 - **4 ERC (StG, 2 CoG, AdG)**
 - **4 ITN projects (1 coordination)**
 - **1 Infrastructure project**
 - **1 FET Open**



Recycling of H2020 proposals is both

EASY

and

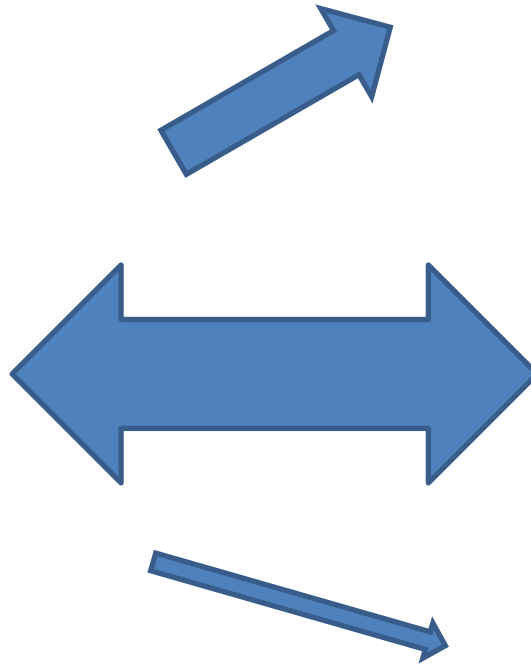
DIFFICULT



Recycling from one bottom up instrument to another is often feasible

Projects in top down instruments are difficult to recycle.

Faced challenges:

- NO matching topic in H2020
- Other international funding programmes have limitations
 - who can participate (e.g. NordForsk, Bonus, etc.)
 - what can be funded
- Might be necessary to apply from many sources (e.g. many national applications) → how to match timing, rules, what happens if one partner doesn't get funding, etc.

How we approach

- Discussion and analysis about evaluation summary report and original project idea
- Analysis what funding could be available for the proposal (funding mapping) and with what conditions.



Normally results in several potential applications, strategic approach to find funding for the needed tasks.
